As the City of Caldwell's pool faces another summer closure, the Caldwell Y is open and available to the Caldwell community. The City of Caldwell appreciated the partnership with the Y and the option it provides for our community.

The Caldwell Y, and all Treasure Valley Family Y locations, provide swim lessons and open swim availability year-round. The Y is committed to providing opportunities for people of all ages to learn water safety skills through robust swim lessons, water fitness, and recreational aquatic programming. In addition, multiple fun and skill-building youth day camps are available at all locations, regardless of age or income level.

To use the Caldwell Y pool, or register for an activity, visit the facility or visit the website at ymcatvidaho.org. Access is available through membership to the Y, purchase of a facility day pass, or by registering for one of many programs. Membership and day pass access provides full-facility usage including the climbing wall, gymnasium, cardio and weight rooms, group exercise classes, youth activity center, and more. Financial assistance is available and fees are determined on a sliding scale according to household income. No one is turned away due to the inability to pay.

Facility Day Pass: Youth \$6.75, Adult \$13.25, Family \$26.25.

Construction is currently underway on the city pool. The goal was to reopen the pool in the summer of 2024. The new completion date is now late July (depending on the weather) and open for summer of 2025. This delay is due to several incidents, including weather and unknown utilities in the area that needed to be removed.
