CALDWELL POLICE DEPARTMENT PRESS RELEASE

DATE: January 13, 2023

UPDATE: Preliminary results have determined that a murder-suicide resulted in the deaths of the two males. The coroner's office will release the names.

ORIGINAL RELEASE: Caldwell Police detectives are investigating what appears to be a murder after a domestic disturbance early this morning.

At 6:30 a.m., officers responded to a stabbing on Shelburne Street. Upon arrival, they discovered two males on the floor of the home with what appeared to be multiple stab wounds. One male was deceased and the other was conscious and breathing.

Officers attempted life saving measures for this person and he was transported to Saint Alphonsus Medical Center in Boise; however, he later succumbed to his injuries.

We are in the preliminary stages of our investigation. CPD detectives, Canyon County Sheriff's Office crime lab personnel and investigators from the Canyon County Coroner's Office are currently processing the scene and gathering further details as to what occurred. The circumstances of their deaths are pending until an autopsy can be completed and the evidence is collected and analyzed. Names are being withheld, pending notifications to next of kin.

It is important to know that this was an isolated domestic related incident and there is no threat to the community at this time. We are not actively searching for a suspect(s) and witnesses have been cooperative with investigators.

"This is a very tragic incident and I am saddened by the horrific news this morning. I send my condolences to the family affected by this atrocity and offer any support we can. Our investigators will work around the clock to determine the motive and circumstances surrounding this incident. I want to thank the Canyon County Sheriff for his immediate support and deployment of the crime lab," said Rex Ingram, Caldwell Chief of Police.
